Having just celebrated the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord during Holy Week and Easter, on the Saturday of the Octave of Easter, the Academy of the Annunciation invites you to contemplate the experience of the disciples on the Road to Emmaus.

In this Introductory Study Day, we will explore this Resurrection day story in the Gospel of St Luke. Wouldn't we have loved to have been there as the "Lord interpreted to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself" (Lk 24:27) beginning with Moses and all the prophets?

Looking carefully at this text from Luke 24, we will see how our experience at Holy Mass mirrors the experience of these disciples on Resurrection day.

This introductory study day will encourage students to read God's Word more attentively and provide an opportunity to discover the hidden meaning of this text.
